

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE NSS UNIT BETHUADAHARI COLLEGE

(2018-2019)

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME, BETHUADAHARI COLLEGE UNIT

The NSS Unit of Bethuadahari College organized different Programmes and activities for the financial year 2018-2019 as under:

### **1. Observance of Days with Special Significance:**

The NSS Unit of the College observed the Independence Day (15.08.2018); Teachers' Day (05.09.2018); National Youth Day (12.01.2019); Netaji Subhas Chandra's Birthday (23.01.2019); and the Republic Day(26.01.2019) with grandeur. These days were observed with flag hoisting and other related activities.

### **2. Organized Seminars on Important Social Issues like AIDS , CYBER CRIME & IMMORAL TRAFICKING:**

#### **A. World AIDS Day:**

The National Service Scheme Unit of the College organized a seminar on the RED RIBBON DAY or the WORLD AIDS DAY on 01.12.2018 in the Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Sabhagriha of the College. In order to observe the Red Ribbon Day, Dr. Souvik Mandal, a Medical Officer of the local Block Primary Hospital was present on behalf of Block Medical Officer of Health, Nakashipara Development Block and presented a lucid lecture on AIDS awareness. In addition to this, renowned local physician Dr. Asit Sarkar, M.D. was another resource person who delivered his valuable speech on the relevant topic. This apart, Sri Manas Som, ICD Counsellor and Siblal Tudu, ITS, Bethuadahari Hospital took part in the

Seminar as the Resource Persons. Most of the teachers of our College and all NSS Volunteers also took part in the discussion.

The NSS Unit of the College in collaboration with Nakashipara Police Station organized a Seminar on “ Im-moral Trafficking and Cyber Crime” in the Madan Mohan Tarkalankar Sabhagriha of the College on 03.01.2019. It is a burning social problem for the locality as the College is situated in the border area of Bangladesh. The Officer-in-Charge of the Nakashipara Police Station Sri Amiyatosh Basu was the Chief Resource Person of the Seminar. Sri Kali Prasanna Das, the President of the Governing Body of the College presided over the Seminar Session. Sri Das delivered a brief note on the theme of the Seminar. Apart this, a few teachers of the College and some of the NSS Volunteers also spoke on it. The interactive session was very attractive and the volunteers actively participated in it. They enjoyed the Seminar whole heartedly.

### **3. Organized Cleanliness Drive and Swachha Bharat Abhiyan:**

The NSS Volunteers of Bethuadahari College along with the NSS Programme Officer and a few interested teaching and non-teaching Staff cleaned the College Campus and washed the Statues of great personalities on 14.08.2018, 09.10.2018, 30.10.2018, 11.01.2019, 22.01.2019, 25.01.2019 and 13.02.2019. They walked in a Rally for making more awareness on Swachha Bharat Abhiyan on 09.10.2018.

### **4. Participation in Tree Plantation Programme adjacent to the College Campus:**

The NSS Volunteers of the College participated in Tree Plantation Programme on 25.08.2018 on the newly purchased field adjacent to College Playground. They planted various types of saplings in the field and drenched with water the saplings time to time.

### **5. Organized Awareness Programmes**

The NSS Volunteers of the College participated in the Seminar on “Career in Armed Forces” organized by the NCC Unit of the College on 29.08.2018 and they also took active participation in the Question-Answer Session of the said Seminar.

#### **6. Participation in Social Extension:**

The Volunteer of the NSS Unit visited locality near the College under Bethuadahari –II Gram Panchayat in order to create awareness of the Cleanliness , Health and Hygiene among the villagers.

The NSS Volunteers also took part in the Rally organized by the Bethuadahari Book Fair Committee on 15.03.2019 as a part of Inaugural Programme of the said Fair.

#### **7. Organized Special Camp (25.02.2019 – 03.03.2019)**

The Special Camp of the NSS Unit of Bethuadahari College was held in Bethuadahari G.S.F.P.Girls’ School during the period beginning from 25<sup>th</sup> February, 2019 to the 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2019 and was inaugurated by Dr. Swapan Kumar Roy, Teacher-in-Charge, Bethuadahari College on 25.02.2019. Dr. Suhas Roy, Associate Professor & the IQAC Co-ordinator of the College and Prof. Ranjan Banerjee, ANO, NCC (14<sup>th</sup> Battelion) Unit of the College were also present on behalf of the College. The NSS Programme Officer invited the Headmistress and the Assistant Teachers of the host College for attending the inaugural programme. The Headmistress Mrs. Puspa Roy along with her colleagues attended the said programme. This apart, a local social worker, Sri Sushanta Kumar Basu was also present. The NSS Volunteers who were selected for joining the Special Camp reported the Camp Venue before 9 AM. They cleaned the School Campus and participated in the Morning Prayer. The inaugural programme was scheduled at 11 AM. Without making any

delay the said Programme was started. An Assistant Teacher of the host School gave lead in the inaugural song “Dhana Dhanya Puspa Bhara, Amader Ei Basundhara/ Tahar Majhe Achhe Desh Ek Sakal Desher Sera”. Our Volunteers made it chorus. The Camp was inaugurated through lightening of a Candle and short deliberation of the Teacher-in-Charge, Bethuadahari College. After it, The NSS Programme Officer, Prof. Asish Kumar Sannigrahi delivered the welcome address. Thereafter, Headmistress of the host School gave a short lecture. An assistant Teacher, Sri Sushanta Kumar Basu followed them. Dr. Suhas Roy and Prof. Ranjan Banerjee also raised the relevant issues. This session was expired at 1-30 PM. After it, Lunch break was declared. In the post Lunch session, taking rest for a while, the Volunteers visited the village households and distributed a leaflet containing basic lessons on health and hygiene. The main theme of the Camp was “ Health and Care”.

On the Day-2, the Volunteers started with light physical exercise and cleaned the venue of the Camp. After refreshment, they walked out with sacks of bleaching powder to each household. They also took bottles of Phenyl. They cleaned the garbage around the village and cleaned the filthy areas of the locality. They sprayed bleaching powder and sprinkled Phenyl. They distributed pouch packets of bleaching powder to each household. The Programme Officer Prof. Asish Kumar sannigrahi along with another teacher Prof. Subhajit Sen and the aforesaid social worker Sri Sushanta Kumar Basu headed the NSS Volunteers. It continued till the Lunch break was declared at 1-30 PM. In the Post-Lunch Session, Prof. Sanjay Saha and Prof. Tania Das delivered speeches towards the students of the said School and NSS Volunteers.

On the third day, same activities were performed in the rest part of the locality. In the Post-Lunch Session, the Programme Officer handed over

to the NSS Volunteers a Questionnaire on “Do’s and Don’ts for Healthy Practices” and guided them how to reach the households to get the questionnaires filled up.

On the fourth and fifth day, the Volunteers surveyed the target area along with structured questionnaires in the pre-lunch session. In the post-Lunch Session, Dr. Tapan Kumar Pande, Associate Professor, Department of Bengali and Prof. Sanjay Saha, Department of History visited the Camp. They delivered lectures on “Usefulness of social service and students’ role in it”. On the fifth day, the Volunteers cleaned the GSPF Girls’ School building and its adjacent area on that day Prof. Prakash Chandra Mandal took a class on “How to keep yourself physically fit?”. Dr. Suhas Roy took classes on “The Enjoyment of Selfless Social Service” and Prof. Tarun Kanti Kumar delivered a lecture on “Unitedly we can do many Great Works”.

On the sixth day, a Rally was organized by the NSS Volunteers with banners and placards for making aware of the cleanliness and healthy habits. They walked about one and half kilometer round the village. In the post-Lunch session, Prof. Sanjoy Ghosh, Department of Physical Education, Bethuadahari College took a class.

On the closing day, some volunteers of previous year visited the Camp. They participated in the Cultural Programme with the Volunteers. Some teachers and non-teaching staff of the College were also present in the Cultural Programme Lunch was declared. After Lunch the Volunteers were released from the Camp. The Volunteers left the Camp with the tears of joy and of course with a lot of sweet memories.

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
